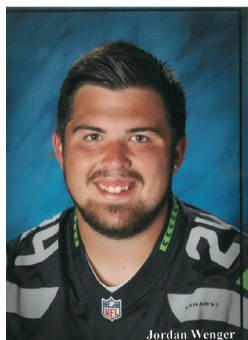

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Tutoring

Daytime Tutoring

The Communities In Schools of Auburn site coordinator provides academic interventions for students, 6th through 8th grade, upon referral from their classroom teacher on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Study Hub

Students receive homework help, tutoring and a quiet space to study with support from the site coordinator. Study Hub takes place in the library every Monday and Wednesday.

One-on-One

We recruit community volunteers to work with students one-on-one after school for an hour a week on referral from school
